












# Elm Trees In Owen Park

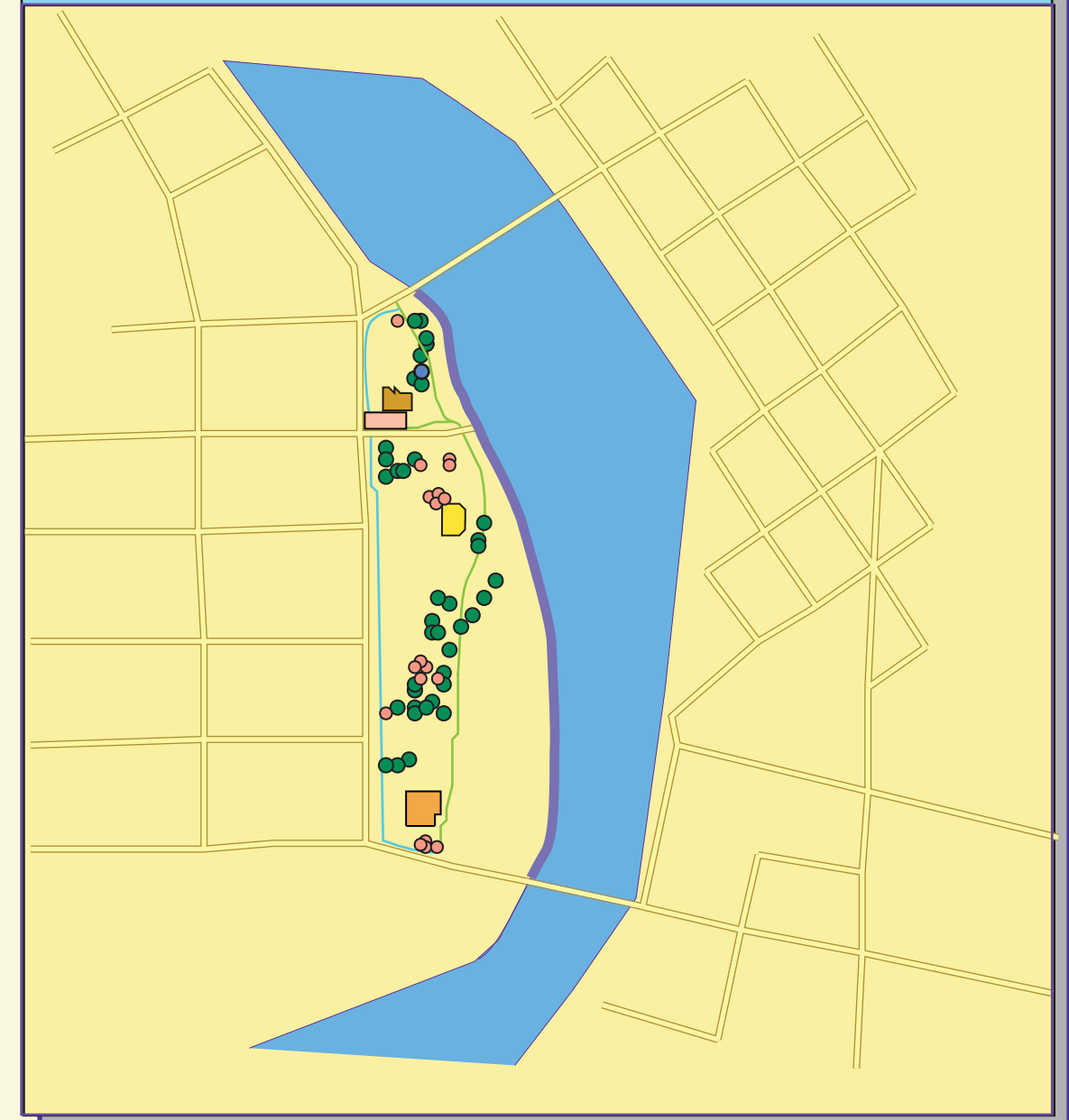

## Park Features



Most of Eau Claire's Elm trees not killed by Dutch Elm Disease are in Owen Park. The purpose of this project was to map them, and their relative location to major features of the park. These were found to be of the largest Elms inside the city limits. Each one is individually numbered, registered, and tracked by the Parks & Rec. Department.

Data was collected with a Trimble DGPS in the mid to late afternoon, when satellite availability and positioning results in erratic PDOPs. This caused some trees to not be recorded, as well as erratic placement of some point, line, and region features. Most errors were correctable using the editing tools supplied with the Adobe Illustrator software.
